A mushroom is the fleshy, spore bearing fruiting body of a fungus, typically produced above ground on soil or on its food source. Mushrooms are low in calories, fat free, cholesterol-free and very low in sodium, yet they provide several nutrients that are found in animal foods or grains. Like all fruits and vegetables, mushrooms are naturally gluten free, and make a delicious and nutritious addition to the diet. Gluten is a protein cause diseases. Most mushrooms sold in supermarkets have been commercially grown on mushroom farms. Some mushrooms used as a medicinal such as cardiovascular disorders. Mushrooms contain rich polysaccharides, glycoproteins and proteoglycans are under basic research for their potential to modulate immune system responses and inhibit tumour growth whereas other isolates show potential antiviral, antibacterial, anti-parasitic, anti-inflammatory and antidiabetic properties in preliminary studies. In recent years, increasing influence in developing countries has led to a considerable growth in interest in mushroom cultivation. This workshop will provide adequate knowledge on importance of mushroom in daily life. Techniques in cultivation of mushroom particularly for the individuals who are interested in setting up their own units under small scale industry.
